Complaint Summary

Plaintiffs alleged that chemical dumping, negligent storage, and false transportation practices caused property damage, groundwater concerns, business losses, and ongoing monitoring expenses. The complaint referenced tanker movements, aging storage units, and irregular disposal records associated with Altona's northern operations.

The defense denied all wrongdoing, challenged causation, disputed venue, and asserted that governmental and third-party conduct contributed to any alleged contamination. Defense counsel also reserved the right to pursue counterclaims for defamation, business interference, and abusive process.

Key Allegations

- Improper transport and disposal of hazardous liquids.
- Failure to secure or accurately identify chemical contents in storage.
- Concealment of true waste origin and destination through incomplete documentation.
- Use of shell vendors and side agreements to mask the cost of disposal.
- Interference with landowner investigation through delayed or incomplete disclosure.

Disposition

The parties entered a confidential settlement after mediation. No defendant admitted fault.
